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
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
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


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1. McNay Art Museum

6000 N New Braunfels Ave



Formerly located on the grounds of the McNay Art Museum was the San Antonio Art Institute, where Pace attended sculpture lessons led by local artist Bill FitzGibbons. There, she met many of the Institute's artists in residence. Meeting and seeing these artists' processes was a deeply influential experience that taught her how residency programs greatly benefitted students, emerging artists, and even the visiting artists themselves.

Take a photo in front of Tom Wesselman's *Standing Tulip*, 1989/2020, located within the McNay's Sculpture Garden.

2. San Antonio Museum of Art

200 W Jones Ave



In addition to gifting art from her collection to the San Antonio Museum of Art, Pace's own work, *Red Project*, 2001, was first publicly exhibited here in 2001 within the Great Hall. Former Artpace exhibitor, Gary Sweeney, has work displayed within the museum grounds!

Take a photo of yourself in front of his outdoor installation, *Art is the Stored Honey of the Human Soul*, 2001, located by the museum parking lot.

3. The Pearl

136 E Grayson St




Linda Pace's great aunt, Emma Koehler, served as chief executive to the San Antonio Brewing Company, which grew into the Pearl Brewery we know today. Hotel Emma is named after this industrious woman and the building that now houses the hotel once served as a brewhouse for the historic Pearl.

Take a photo with the Emma Koehler street sign, located near Lick Honest Ice Creams and Hotel Emma, as shown in the map.

4. San Antonio Public Library

600 Soledad St




Longtime friend and artist Jesse Amado was commissioned by the Linda Pace Foundation to create a work that commemorated Pace's life. The resulting work, *Days*, 2010, consists of 22,615 glass teardrops, one for each day of Pace's life (1945-2007).

Take a photo of yourself outside in front of the installation window, located near the entrance to the library.

5. Southwest School of Art

300 Augusta St



Pace's passion for art patronage was instilled in her by her mother, Margaret Pace Wilson, who was one of the co-founders of the Southwest School of Art.

Take a photo of yourself outside the Urschel Building on the historic campus facade, Southwest School of Art, Urschel Building, 300 Augusta St, San Antonio, Texas.

6. Bar America

723 S Alamo St



During his residency at Artpace in 1993, Isaac Julien and Pace forged a lifelong friendship. Consequently, Ruby City has the largest collection of his work in the world! During Julien's residency, he filmed part of *The Long Road to Mazatlan*, 1993, at Bar America. This establishment was frequented by local artists and became the site of many gatherings that Pace hosted for visiting and local artists.


Take a photo with the neon sign located outside of Bar America.

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7. Artpace

445 N Main Ave



Founded by Pace in 1993, Artpace became the premier artist residency in the country, bringing regional, national and international artists to San Antonio, giving them the means to make new works of art.

Take a photo of yourself outside of Artpace's Main Space, located at the front of the building. Artpace is free and open to the public; for access to the exhibitions make an appointment to visit!

8. Ruby City

150 Camp St



Envisioned in 2007 by Pace, Ruby City represents her greatest creation. The red-hued concrete building, designed by renowned architect Sir David Adjaye, presents works from Pace's personal collection of more than 900 paintings, sculptures, installations and video works by regional and international artists. Curated shows and programming are presented throughout the year.

Take a photo of yourself outside in front of the work of art *Be Amazing*, which you can see through the lobby windows.

Other Sites Along the Way

Sloan/Hall

5424 Broadway

Located in the landmark Mobil gas station building on Broadway, Sloan/Hall offers a wide variety of curated gifts, jewelry, fashion and perfumes. Pace was good friends with the owners Marcus Sloan and Shannon Hall, who also have a location in Houston as well!

Chamoy City Limits

447 W Hildebrand Ave #105

Founded and run by Linda Pace Foundation collection artist, Ana Fernandez, a painter and whose work is currently on view in Ruby City's exhibition *Waking Dream*, this raspa restaurant features mangonadas, Big Red ice-cream floats, and custom cakes!

Liberty Bar

1111 S Alamo St

A frequently visited restaurant by Pace and artists from the community. Liberty Bar commissioned artist Jesse Amado to design wallpaper for the first-floor dining room and the exterior paint color was chosen by the late artist Chuck Ramirez. Both Amado and Ramirez are Linda Pace Foundation collection artists.

Wong's Bodega

1502 S Flores St

Located within the historic Wong's Grocery Company building in Southtown, Wong's Bodega features healthy food and drink options including a variety of vegan and vegetarian selections.

Bandera Rosa
